You'll find great shopping in our antique shops, fine arts gallery, novelty shops, gift shops and food market.

There are numerous dining options in town, including burgers, ice cream, bakery items, sandwiches, and casual and fine dining restaurants.

All shopping and restaurants are within walking distance of the pier, boardwalk and beach. Or if you'd like, rent a bicycle at the Welcome Center and bike the town. Bicycles, kayaks and paddleboards are available for hourly or daily rental between Memorial Day weekend and Labor Day weekend.

Cash, Visa or Mastercard accepted for payment. ATM is located on boardwalk at Welcome Center. Restrooms, public showers and changing rooms are located behind Welcome Center.



How to find us: From **Washington's Capital Beltway** (I-95/495), take MD Route 4 south into Calvert County. Take the MD Route 260 ramp to the Beaches. See ALL below. From the **Baltimore Beltway** (I-695), take I-97 south, then take US Route 301/MD Route 3 south to MD Route 4 south into Calvert County. Take the MD Route 260 ramp to the Beaches. See ALL below. From **Annapolis**, take Route 2 south to Route 260 east (left). See ALL below. From **Southern Maryland**, take MD Routes 2/4 north to Sunderland. When MD Routes 2/4 split, take MD Route 2 north to MD Route 260 east (right). See ALL below. **ALL:** Follow MD Route 260 until it ends at the Chesapeake Bay. Turn left onto MD Route 261 and go north approximately 0.6 mile. *Free visitor parking is located at the southeast corner of Chesapeake Avenue (Route 261) and 5th Street, one block from beach, pier and boardwalk. Welcome to North Beach!*
